



# Procedure to Train as an RDAA Level 0 Carriage Driving Coach

## 1. How to Apply

Fill out this **Application to Train Form**. Your application must be approved by your Centre Management Committee and signed by your Coach Educator. Send your completed application to your State Office (or to the National Office if you do not have a State Office). Make sure payment for your manuals is made to RDA Australia.

## 2. Choose Your Coach Educator

Discuss your wish to train as a Carriage Driving Coach with RDA Centre personnel such as RDA Centre committee members and RDA Carriage Driving Coaches. Make enquiries about available Vaulting Coach Educators to supervise you. Your Coach Educator does not have to be at your Centre but they should be someone who can support your learning as a mentor, has time to mark your workbooks, answer questions and someone you can build a rapport with.

## 3. Approval of Application

The RDA State Association will inform you that it has ratified your application and will then send your form to RDA Australia for processing.

## 4. Training Materials

RDA Australia will issue your manuals to you once your Application (with completed order form) and payment has been received.

## 5. Completion of Course Requirements

Complete workbook activities and practical coaching under the supervision of your Coach Educator.

## 6. Assessment

When you and your Coach Educator agree you are ready to be assessed, you can choose an RDA National Assessor and make arrangements for your assessment. There are two possible outcomes from the assessment: Competent or Not Competent

## 7. Post Assessment

If assessed as competent, your Assessor will sign off your Competency Assessment Form and forward the paperwork to RDA Australia who will advise your State Office. RDA Australia will send you a Certificate and Coaching card with your new qualification.

If assessed as Not Yet Competent, discussion and advice on further training and assistance is available. If you think your assessment was unfair, you can appeal the decision. Contact RDA Australia for the correct procedure.

### How will you deal with the private information I have included in my submission?

The information gathered on this form is entered into the RDA Australia database of registered coaches, maintained by RDA Australia. This information may be shared with the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) in conjunction with national sporting associations and state sport education centres. Coaches will be sent relevant up-to-date information and may be contacted by the ASC. Your information will not be used or disclosed except in accordance with the provisions of the Privacy Act 1988.

## Information for Applicants

### What are the age, skill and experience pre-requisites for the Level 0 course?

You must:

- Be at least 15 years old at the time of commencing this course
- Be at least 16 years old at the time of completing this course
- Have been a volunteer at RDA for at least 6 months
- Have gained, either through a driving club or RDA Centre, some basic Carriage Driving knowledge.

**Note:** if you have a disability, your case will be considered on its merits

### About the Level 0 Training Course

The RDAA Level 0 training course is designed as an introductory package for candidates who are interested in learning more about the RDA organisation, people with disabilities, how to teach basic driving skills, basic horse care and stable management.

Once completed, you will have met the following Competency Standards:

- Supports the RDA Coach to run an approved program
- Identifies potential safety issues and in conjunction with the RDA Coach, manages them according to RDA and WH&S practices
- Communicates positively with Coach, riders and volunteers using simple instructions relevant to the activities
- Uses special and conventional equipment and a variety of coaching methods appropriate to the skill level of drivers and horses.
- Handles and cares for horses according to RDA methods and best practice.
- Performs all tasks in a respectful manner in accordance with the Coach's Code of Ethics.

The Level 0 course also prepares adult trainees with study and research skills which are necessary for undertaking the RDAA Level 1 Carriage Driving qualification.

### What does the Level 0 Training Package contain?

The Level 0 Training Package contains a generic section that is common across all RDA Training Programs, plus a Sports Specific section for Riding or Carriage Driving, depending on your chosen discipline. Each section comes with an information training manual, a workbook for your answers and sign off sheets for your Coach Educator and Assessor.

### How long will the Level 0 Carriage Driving Coach training take?

It usually takes between 6-12 months to complete the Level 0 qualification if you spend time training once a week/fortnight but you can take up to two years if you need. You can apply for additional time by contacting your State Office to request an extension. As part of your qualification, you must assist a Level 1 Carriage Driving Coach for a minimum of 10 hours at an RDA Centre. To provide evidence of this, log your assistance hours on the **Hours of Coaching** log sheet (supplied in the manual). You can complete your answers in the workbook at your own pace.

<b>1.</b> Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every human being	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Within the context of the activity, treat everyone equally regardless of sex, disability, ethnic origin or religion</li> </ul>
<b>2.</b> Ensure the athlete's time spent with you is a positive experience	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All athletes are deserving of equal attention and opportunities</li> </ul>
Treat each athlete as an individual	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Respect the talent, developmental stage and goals of each athlete</li> <li>• Help each athlete reach their full potential</li> </ul>
<b>4.</b> Be fair, considerate and honest with athletes	
<b>5.</b> Be professional and accept responsibility for your actions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Display high standards in your language, manner, punctuality, preparation and presentation</li> <li>• Display control, respect, dignity and professionalism to all involved with the sport - this includes opponents, coaches, officials, administrators, the media, parents and spectators</li> <li>• Encourage your athletes to demonstrate the same qualities</li> </ul>
<b>6.</b> Make a commitment to providing a quality service to your athletes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Maintain or improve your current NCAS accreditation</li> <li>• Seek continual improvement through performance appraisal and ongoing coach education</li> <li>• Provide a training program which is planned and sequential</li> <li>• Maintain appropriate records</li> </ul>
<b>7.</b> Operate within the rules and spirit of your sport	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The guidelines of national and international bodies governing your sport should be followed. <b>10.</b> Refrain from any form of harassment towards your athletes*	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This includes sexual and racial harassment, racial vilification and harassment on the grounds of disability</li> <li>• You should not only refrain from initiating a relationship with an athlete, but should also discourage any attempt by an athlete to initiate a sexual relationship with you, explaining the ethical basis of your refusal</li> </ul>
<b>11.</b> Provide a safe environment for training and competition	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensure equipment and facilities meet safety standards</li> <li>• Ensure equipment, rules, training and the environment are appropriate for the age and ability of the athletes</li> </ul>
<b>12.</b> Show concern and caution toward sick and injured athletes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide a modified training program where appropriate</li> <li>• Allow further participation in training and competition only when appropriate</li> <li>• Encourage athletes to seek medical advice when required</li> <li>• Maintain the same interest and support toward sick and injured athletes</li> </ul>
<b>13.</b> Be a positive role model for your sport and athletes

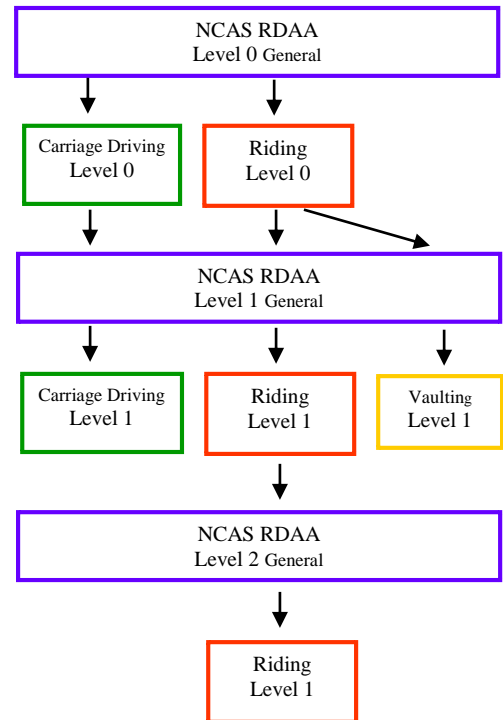
